## BELFAST SUMMER SCHOOL IN LATIN & CLASSICAL GREEK

The fourth Belfast Summer School will take place in July 2019 in the beautiful surroundings of Queen's University Belfast.

Courses will be available in Latin and Classical Greek at beginners, intermediate and advanced levels.



Students may enrol for five days (Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> July – Friday 26<sup>th</sup> July) or nine days (Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> July – Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> August). The summer school will conclude with translation workshops on Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> August.

Time is allocated between sessions for independent study and other activities will include guest lectures. See pages 8-11 for the provisional timetable.

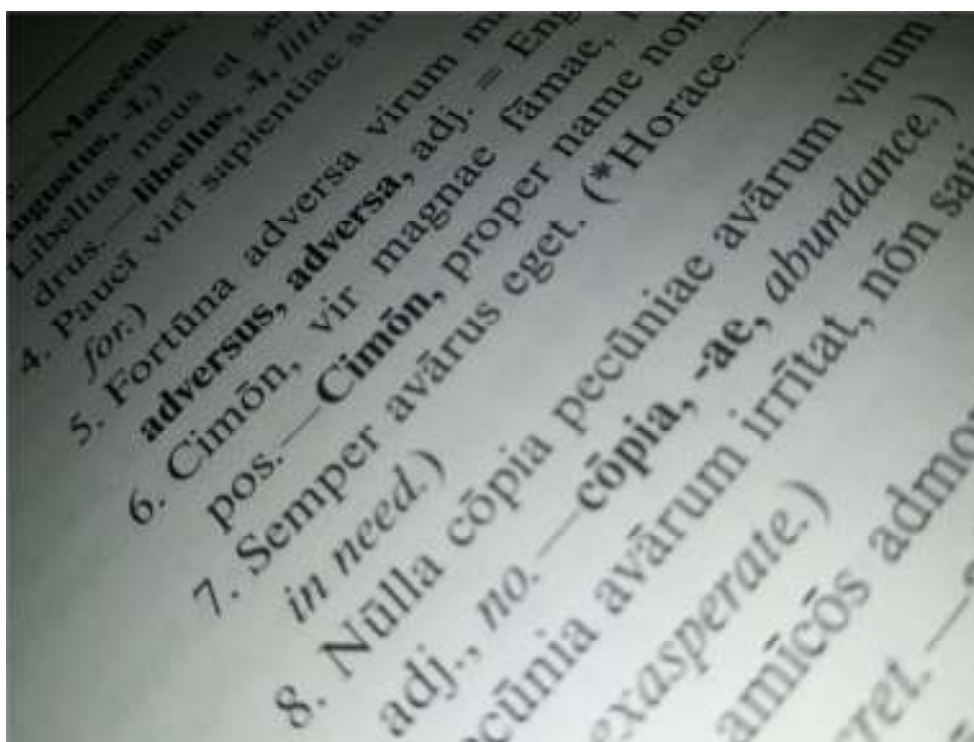
## COURSES OFFERED IN 2019

### LATIN

**Latin for beginners:** no previous knowledge required.

**Intermediate Latin:** Students with a basic knowledge of Latin are asked to include on their application form details of courses already completed and textbooks used. The course will be tailored to meet the needs of students, and tutors will use a variety of resources including *Wheelock's Latin*. Students are asked to bring a small Latin-English/English-Latin dictionary (for example, the Collins Gem Latin Dictionary).

**Advanced Latin:** Advanced classes will read an unadapted text with grammar explanations provided as necessary.



## CLASSICAL GREEK

**Classical Greek for beginners:** no previous knowledge necessary however students are required to learn the Greek alphabet before commencing the course. Instructions and a worksheet will be provided.

**Intermediate Classical Greek:** This course is suitable for students who wish to consolidate their study of basic grammar. Applicants are asked to include on their application form details of courses already completed and textbooks used. The course will be tailored to the needs of students and resources used will include *Athenaze* and *Reading Greek*.

**Advanced Classical Greek:** Advanced classes will read an unadapted text with grammar explanations provided as necessary.



**Students will be provided with worksheets and handouts. It is not necessary to purchase a textbook but you may wish to buy a Latin dictionary or Greek lexicon if you do not already own one.**

**Please note that due to the intensive nature of the courses, it is not possible to take two courses simultaneously.**

## TRANSLATION WORKSHOPS

The Summer School will conclude with Translation Workshops on Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> August. The workshops will be pitched at appropriate levels for both beginners and



intermediate/advanced students in Latin and Greek, and the texts used will complement the work completed in summer school classes. Students who have completed the beginners course will translate adapted texts, while intermediate and advanced students will translate texts which have been only slightly adapted.

## SUMMER SCHOOL SOCIAL

The Summer School dinner will take place on Thursday 25<sup>th</sup> July at 5pm. Venue to be confirmed.

Menu choices and a deposit will be collected on the first day of the summer school.

The dinner is optional.



## PRESENTATION OF CERTIFICATES

The first week of the Summer School will conclude on Friday 26<sup>th</sup> July at 1pm with the presentation of certificates of attendance to those students who are completing one week only. All students are invited to attend. Refreshments will be provided.

To secure a place on the summer school, students should either email or post their registration form, accompanied by either the course fee in full (£140 if registering for the nine day course, £80 if registering for the five day course) or a £50 **non-refundable** deposit. If paying a deposit, the remainder of the course fee must be paid by 7<sup>th</sup> June 2019.

**Emailed forms should be followed within 24 hours by online payment or bank transfer.**

Please note, places on the Summer School cannot be secured until payment is received.

**The summer school is non-residential and is open to all aged 14 and over. Students between the ages of 14 and 17 MUST be accompanied by a chaperone. The chaperone is not required to pay the fee unless participating in the summer school themselves.**
